Previously, I feared that my daughter would dislike maths because she had hated the monotonous homework at other maths tuition schools. She enjoys going to the Sakamoto Maths centre because the classes are small, the teachers are kind and explain how to solve the puzzles in detail. I myself had to take an entrance exam for a graduate school (MBA) overseas and had a lot of difficulty with the maths test in English. I feel that learning mathematics in English is highly versatile for any career choice.

I think it is wonderful that the Sakamoto Method is not a technique theory where you have to memorise how to solve the problem, but that you can deal with difficult problems by mastering the basics of how to solve them. I am convinced that if students in junior high school and senior high school have the proper basics when solving difficult mathematics, they will come to love mathematics.
